Procurement

Lab consumables: Lab consumable expenses reduced by creating healthy competition amongst our suppliers in a very transparent purchase systems.

The discount structures have been maintained at the highest level of 36 % on Lab Chemicals under (ARC) Annual Rate Contract system.

Equipments /Instruments

The need based Equipments /Instruments were only procured both for B. Pharmacy and M. Pharmacy courses.

Internal Controls:

The College Management has developed internal controls on all type of outgoing for effective cost saving. The College conducts its Academic activities with integrity and high standards of ethical behavior, and in compliance with the rules and regulations that govern its activity. The college has established framework of internal controls in operation, supported by approved standard operating procedures, policies, and guidelines.

Feedback systems:

The feedback system of continuous interaction with students was operative for all the four year classes. Deficiency in Teaching, by any faculty was immediately communicated by counseling the concern Faculty and corrected.

Energy & Water Conservation:

Energy Management continues to be our thrust area. All out efforts are taken to conserve the energy through awareness programs to students and staff members and all possible controls measures will be implemented in the coming year to avoid any wastage of energy.
