REGULATORY BODIES:

All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE): Extension of Approval is recommended by AICTE and we are awaiting the downloading of Approvals.

Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) : SUCP had PCI approval for the academic year 2015-16 for both B. Pharm, Pharm D. & Pharm D. (PB), and for the approvals from the academic year 2016-17, completed inspection for Pharm D. & Pharm D. (PB), from 11th – 13th April, 2016 and for B. Pharm course the inspection is scheduled from 3rd - 4th May, 2016.

Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University, Hyderabad (JNTU-H): Another feather in the cap of SUCP is the **5 year Permanent Affiliation given by JNTU-H from the academic year 2014-15 to 2018-19**, making it the first Pharmacy College under JNTU-H for this achievement. However, they inspected once again on 13th April 2016.

MULTIDIMENSIONAL IMPROVISATION:

The progress of an institution is determined by the improvement achieved in all aspects. Hence the following measures implemented from 1st October, 2013 were continued in the academic year 2014-15.

1. Teaching-Learning Process:

Teaching-Learning process is a dynamic activity that needs to be constantly upgraded, monitored and developed to face the current challenges effectively. The steps taken in this direction are:

- a) **Mentoring System** – Each class of B.Pharm is divided into 3 batches and each batch is assigned a faculty member as mentor who would periodically review and counsel the

students in their academics, placements, participation in extracurricular activities and if required their personal problems too. Similarly one faculty member is assigned to each M.Pharm specialization and one faculty member for Pharm. D.

- b) **Feedback** – Feed back was collected from students in every semester and was recorded for further improvement and relevant suggestions are effectively implemented.
- c) **Frequent Staff Meetings** – Teaching staff meetings were held at least once in a month to review the progress of various activities.
- d) **Faculty Development & Recruitment** – **Four** new faculty members were recruited as Assistant Professors. Faculty are constantly encouraged to associate themselves with professional bodies and attend seminars, workshops, faculty development programs to update their knowledge about the latest developments and advances in the pharmaceutical field. It is pertinent to mention here that SUCP has **6 faculty members with Ph.D, 1 faculty member, Mrs. D. Saritha submitted her thesis and 2 others are pursuing their Ph.D.**
- e) **Participation in Seminars / Workshops etc.** – Students under the guidance of faculty members are encouraged to participate in conferences, workshops etc., to broaden their intellectual horizons.
