REGULATORY BODIES:

All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE):

Accorded approval upto 2018-19

Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) : SUCP had PCI 3 year approval for the academic years 2016-17, 2017-18 and 2018-19 for B. Pharm and one year approval for Pharm D. & Pharm D. (PB) for 2016-17. For academic year 2017-18 completed inspection for Pharm D. & Pharm D. (PB) and increase in intake for B.Pharm from existing 60 to 100 on 5th to 7th April, 2017.

Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University, Hyderabad (JNTU-H): Another feather in the cap of SUCP is the **5 year Permanent Affiliation given by JNTU-H from the academic year 2014-15 to 2018-19**, making it the first Pharmacy College under JNTU-H for this achievement. However, they are inspecting every year and this year inspection was completed on 1st April 2017.

MULTIDIMENSIONAL IMPROVISATION:

The progress of an institution is determined by the improvement achieved in all aspects. Hence the following measures implemented from 1st October, 2013 were continued in the academic year 2016-17.

1. Teaching-Learning Process:

Teaching-Learning process is a dynamic activity that needs to be constantly upgraded, monitored and developed to face the current challenges effectively. The steps taken in this direction are:

- a) **Mentoring System** – Each class of B.Pharm is divided into 3 batches and each batch is assigned a faculty member as mentor who would periodically review and counsel the students in their academics, placements, participation in extracurricular activities and if required their personal problems too. Similarly one faculty member is assigned to each M.Pharm specialization and one faculty member for Pharm. D.
- b) **Feedback** – Feedback was collected from students in every semester and was recorded for further improvement and relevant suggestions are effectively implemented.
- c) **Frequent Staff Meetings** – Teaching staff meetings were held at least once in a month to review the progress of various activities.
- d) **Faculty Development & Recruitment** – **Seven** new faculty members were recruited as Assistant Professors. Faculty are constantly encouraged to associate themselves with professional bodies and attend seminars, workshops, faculty development programs to update their knowledge about the latest developments and advances in the pharmaceutical field. It is pertinent to mention here that SUCP has **5 faculty members with Ph.D, 2 faculty members, Dr. D. Saritha & Dr. J.Raghuram received their Ph.D Degree and another Ph.D. Dr. Y.Rajesh Babu was appointed. Now SUCP has 8 Doctorates.**
- e) **Participation in Seminars / Workshops etc.** – Students under the guidance of faculty members are encouraged to participate in conferences, workshops etc., to broaden their intellectual horizons.
